### SCHOOL UNIFORMS

The school “*Summer Uniform*” may be worn until October 31<sup>st</sup>. Remember belts are to be worn with the navy blue Flynn & O'Hara shorts. White socks, preferably “crew socks”, that go over the ankles should be worn. Please check your children to ensure they comply with our dress code. Girls in grades 5 – 8 may wear the St. Elizabeth polo shirt with their skirt.

### EMERGENCY INFORMATION SHEETS

Along with this newsletter you will receive an Emergency Information Sheet for each of your children. Please fill out all of the information on both sides and **return immediately**, but no later than **Thursday, September 1<sup>st</sup>**. A form needs to be filled out for each child.

### FAMILY SURVEY

A family survey will be sent home on Wednesday, August 31<sup>st</sup>. We ask that you please fill out the survey; it is a diocesan requirement. Please **return it by Wednesday, September 14<sup>th</sup>**. As stated in the letter that accompanies the survey, we receive federal funding for a variety of materials and

services. The information you provide is compiled and then sent to the appropriate agency that allots tax dollars back to our school. Information is kept confidential.

### BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT

This year “**Back to School Night**” is scheduled for **Thursday, September 15<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm** in the Parish Hall. Please make every effort to have your family represented at this meeting. We ask that at least one parent attend – **no children please**, as the meeting will not keep their attention.

There will be a used uniform sale that same night. Mrs. Fiore will be in the Parish Hall at 6 pm if you need to purchase uniforms.

### FUNDRAISERS

Fundraising is an integral part of the school income to help defray costs we incur. We begin the school year with the “**SaveAround**” and “**KidStuff**” books fundraiser. **The books will be sent home on Wednesday, September 7<sup>th</sup> and the fundraiser ends September 28<sup>th</sup>**. We ask that each family buy or sell at least one “**SaveAround**” book for \$20 or one “**KidStuff Book**” for \$25. You can purchase more books after paying for the one that was sent home. *Sell 5 and get 1 free*. If you do not want to buy or sell the books, please send them back in the original bag or envelope, as soon as possible. Thank you for your cooperation.

Our “**Scrip**” Fundraiser will begin **November 2<sup>nd</sup> and end November 30<sup>th</sup>**. This gives you time to ask your Thanksgiving guests if they'd like to purchase gift cards. Over 50 stores, restaurants and businesses will be featured. The cards make great Christmas presents for those hard to shop for relatives and friends.

As always, you may choose the buy-out option of fundraising. **The fee is \$25, for each campaign run by the school** (this does not include fundraisers run by HASA). We try to have fundraisers that interest all and will fit into everyone's budgets, and hope you will continue supporting all our events. We encourage families to participate in all fundraising efforts, so this policy will not have to be enforced.

## DESIGNER CLOTHING SALE

The School Board will sponsor a “**Designer Clothing Sale**” on **Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup>** from **9 am – 4pm** in the Parish Hall.

## GIFT CARDS

**Remember to purchase Gift Cards throughout the school year.** Send your orders and money in

with your child in the morning and they’ll bring them home that same day. Gift cards are also available for purchase at Saint Elizabeth rectory, and after most Masses at Saint Elizabeth Church.

Did you know that if you buy Giant, Redner’s or Weis cards you can use them to purchase a variety of other gift cards in those stores? Next time you are at either of these stores, check out their gift card displays. And, you can use Kohl’s gift cards to pay off your credit card bills at those stores. We also have a limited number of Applebee’s, Barnes and Noble, Bath & Body Works, Elias Market, I-Tunes, JC Penney, Macy’s, Panera and Ruby Tuesday cards for sale.

## PARENT/STUDENT HANDBOOK

The following items reiterate information found in the Parent/Student Handbook. Everyone needs to follow these rules to ensure a safe and successful school year!

**Daily Schedule** – Children are to assemble in the schoolyard in the morning. In inclement weather, they are to go to the Parish Hall.



Please drop your children off before 8 am, but not before 7:40 am. There is NO formal supervision before 7:40 am. We will salute our flag before we enter school and the prayer bell will ring in school at 8:10.

**Dismissal** – Our regular dismissal is at 2:50 pm. Please make sure your children know what arrangements they are to follow after school. A teacher escorts children to their buses and a teacher and a crossing guard cross the students to the parking lot. For those of you picking up your children, please follow these rules:

- Do not park in front of the school or on the street, but rather in the schoolyard
- Do not park in the first row of spaces. This is where the children gather to look for their rides
- Do not move your car until all children are safely in their cars
- Make sure your child is picked up by 3 pm (Extended Day care is available from 3 – 6 pm)

If you need to come into the office, have an appointment with Sister Bonita or a teacher after school; *please wait until all students have left the building before entering.* This prevents a lot of confusion on everyone’s part.

If your child normally rides the bus and you plan to pick him or her up, please make every effort to notify the office beforehand. It saves a lot of time and avoids much uncertainty on the student's and teacher's part. You should also notify the school district that buses your child of the change.

**Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade students should wear a note pinned to their uniforms for the first two weeks of school stating the mode of transportation for dismissal (i.e., Bus 82, Pick Up, Extended Day, etc.)**

***Absences*** – We ask that you call the school office between 7 and 10 am to report your child absent (*try not to call between 8:10 and 8:20 as we are saying morning prayers at that time*). A note explaining your child's absence (the reason and the dates) must be sent to school upon his or her return. Let's continue to keep absences on Mondays and Fridays to a minimum; your child's education is very important. Homework requests should be in by 10 am also, so the teacher can get the work ready for pick up at the end of the day.

***Lunch*** – Menus are sent home usually the second Wednesday of the month. **Please return them on time, so your child is ensured a hot lunch.**



Remember, **you will need to pack a lunch for your children the first week of school.** Milk and drinks will be sold, but no snacks. ***Please do not bring in "fast food" (McDonalds, Burger King, Wendy's, etc.) for lunch at any time during the school year. Hot lunches will be served beginning Tuesday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. Don't forget to pack a healthy snack for morning recess – to support our "Wellness Policy".***

***School Calendar and Newsletter*** – Remember we're "going green". ***This will be your last hard copy of the newsletter.*** The August newsletter had a coupon for you to clip and send in stating how you'd like the newsletter sent home; please send it in as soon as possible. Both the newsletter and calendar will be emailed to you and are easily accessible on our website - [www.sercc.org/school](http://www.sercc.org/school). You'll find them on the left side of the home page along with the lunch menu. They will be available on-line the last Wednesday of each month. This

communication effort keeps you informed of school events, early dismissals, holidays, etc. Please keep the calendar accessible for reference during the month.

***Gym Classes*** – Gym classes are held on Wednesday afternoon for 7th and 8th grade students, and all day Thursday for the other grades. **There is no gym class the first week of school.** Children wear their gym clothes to school on their designated gym day. **Required attire is: Saint Elizabeth T-shirt, Saint Elizabeth shorts** - available for purchase at school **or solid/plain navy blue shorts** (no stripes or logos), and the **Saint Elizabeth sweatshirt and sweatpants, when the weather turns colder, white gym socks that cover the ankle (not sport socks those that are in the shoe) and sneakers.** The required items are the only ones accepted for wear that day. No other shirts or sweats are allowed. And please remember when the sweat suit is worn, the shorts and T-shirt must be worn underneath.

***Medicine*** – Students are not permitted to keep any type of medication on them at any time. This includes pain relievers and inhalers. If your child needs prescribed medication during school hours, you will need to fill out a form stating the type of medication, and the required dosage. We cannot administer any type of medicine without the written consent of a parent (this includes Tylenol® or Motrin®).



If your child is required to take any medication, it should be in the **original container and not in a plastic bag.** Medication is given to students between 12 noon and 1 pm. Medications that require three doses in a day do not need to be brought to school. You can give one dose to your child in the morning, then one after school and then again at bedtime.

***School Security*** – School doors are locked at all times. Please ring the bell at the main entrance for access. ***Students are not permitted to open the doors,*** even if they know who you are. **Visitors and/or volunteers must report to the office before proceeding to their destination.** This includes former students. Please do not enter the school through any other doors. If for some reason you gained entry through the Parish Hall, we ask that you go around to the front school entrance to enter the school. **Visitors are not to roam the halls** without

letting someone in the school office know of their whereabouts. Teachers are not to be disturbed during teaching time!

**Telephone Calls** – Students are only allowed to use the school phone in the office after obtaining permission from their teacher, Sister Bonita, or Mrs. Glover. **Students are not permitted to use cell phones in the school at any time** – they will be confiscated and a parent will need to come in to the school to pick them up. Please do not call the school office to ask to talk to your child. If you have an emergency, we will make sure your child receives the message and if necessary will be allowed to speak to you.

**Tuition** – All tuition accounts must be kept up to date. Report cards will not be issued if an account is delinquent. Notes will not be sent home reminding any one of their delinquency before report cards are issued. If you are having financial difficulty, please notify us immediately.

### **EXTENDED DAY**

Extended Day Care is held immediately after school in the Child Care Center, under the direction of Mrs. Maria Sosa. Before school care is held on a limited basis. All children must be registered before they can be sent to Extended Day. It cannot be used as a drop-in service. Please call Ms. Sosa at 610-262-1322 for more information.

### **THE FOUR RS**

The new school year is here! You can help make it a successful one by setting the stage for learning. Share these four Rs with your youngster:

**Religion** – Getting to Mass on the weekend can be the best gift you can give to your family. When in church, our children are surrounded by the Body of Christ – people who care about and pray for them. Mass becomes a refuge in an extremely intimidating world. Attending Mass in the beginning of the week helps children learn that God comes first on Sunday and every day.

**Readiness** – Ensure your children go to school ready to learn every day: Speak positively to your children about school and the teachers. Your attitude toward learning will send a powerful message to your youngster. See to it that your children get at least eight hours of sleep and a

nutritious breakfast so they will feel rested and alert.

**Routines** – Develop simple routines for smooth, stress free mornings: Have your children put everything they need for school in a special “grab ‘n’ go corner. Together, create a regular morning routine.

**Responsibility** – Teach your children responsibility by helping them get organized: Make sure your children have their weekly planner to write down assignments and due dates. Show them how to mark dates on a calendar so you can both keep track of assignments. Ensure your children use their ‘take home’ folder; this is where permission slips and notices of special events go so they don’t get lost.
