PASTOR'S CORNER

As Catholics, we think of Peter as the saint, the first Pope, the one with the Keys to the Kingdom, the rock on whom the Church was built. The basilica that bears his name sits in the center of Rome. Yet Scripture passages such as today's Gospel show us a more headstrong and human side of Peter, one who was far from a perfect disciple. In today's Gospel passage, Peter could not accept the fate Jesus foretold of himself. In fact, Peter rebuked Jesus when he predicted he would suffer and die. Peter's words - as faith-filled as they might be - still demonstrated a lack of understanding of what was happening around him. He seems to want to stop the plan of salvation that was in motion, thinking that he knew better.

Luckily for Peter - and for all of us - perfection is not a qualification for discipleship. What are the necessary qualifications? The answer is to have faith and to follow Jesus' commands. This entails denying oneself, taking up one's cross, and losing one's life for the sake of Jesus and the Gospel. These are the works without which faith is dead.

Like Peter, we are not perfect disciples. Though we have faith sometimes we think first of what we want - what feels good and safe - rather than thinking what God wants. But if we go our own way rather than God's, we risk becoming a mouthpiece for the things of the world and its earthly values, and the self-serving life we tried to save we will lose. Even if we are unsure of exactly what God is asking of us, or if it seems risky and uncertain, God invites us to trust. If we just get behind Jesus, he will guide us. Jesus will teach us what to do and how to follow him.

God is near, upholding us. He is our help, present to us in His Word and in the Eucharist. Nourished by these, we can set our faces like flint and not turn back, even as we confront opposition, The Lord will save us as we follow him in faith.

Missing Monstrance Returned. Was it the One Stolen from Ciszek Chapel in Shenandoah? It's a Mystery.

For St. Elizabeth Parish a little bit of irony.....



Call it the mystery of the missing monstrance. Nearly 15 years ago, a monstrance and tabernacle were stolen from the Adoration Chapel of the Fr Walter Ciszek Center in Shenandoah.

The tabernacle, the locked repository for storing Holy Communion hosts was found a few months later in the nearby woods. The ciborium, a covered vessel in the tabernacle that holds the Holy Eucharist, also was recovered. But the monstrance was not found. Now, in the Year of the Real Presence, a monstrance has been returned to the Church.

Is it the same monstrance stolen in Shenandoah those many years ago? Some people think it is, and others are not sure. Where has it been all these years? That's a bit of a mystery. It was found in a dumpster in New Jersey.

What is known for sure is that the monstrance was returned recently to St. Elizabeth Parish in Whitehall. Fr John Pendzick, who was Pastor at the time, called around to see if any other priests knew about a stolen monstrance.

"We're just thankful that it was returned, even though the details of its long journey, and even whether it is in fact the monstrance from Shenandoah, are a bit sketchy," said Msgr David James, diocesan Vicar General.

After a good cleaning and some needed refinishing, the monstrance will be blessed and then used for Adoration at Divine Mercy Parish, Shenandoah, the home of the Fr Walter Ciszek Center.

Irony – Msgr Muntone started and supported Fr Ciszek's canonization. A monstrance, possibly the missing one from Shenandoah, was returned to St. Elizabeth by Mary Mongolitz, the woman who cared for Msgr. Muntone's mother, while she resided at St. Elizabeth. - *Edited from AD Today Aug 6th.*
