PASTOR'S CORNER

We all want things. Yet I don't have to tell you that we don't always get what we want. Sometimes, if we're being honest with ourselves, we have to admit that we don't always get what we want simply because we don't want it bad enough.

How many of us want to lose weight, but don't want to exercise and eat right. How many of us want the 'A', but don't want to do the homework? Wanting something is one thing. Doing what it takes to get what we want is something different altogether.

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths'. So says John the Baptist, his voice crying out in the desert, trying to get people to be ready for the imminent coming of God. He tells them to 'make straight their paths', in other words, 'make sure that you are making it easy for God to get to you, make sure that there are no obstacles in his way. Put another way, it's as if John is telling them that God will do his part, but they need to do theirs.

God is coming. That much is true. And you know, that's what Advent is all about. Yet, we are not simply preparing to remember what God did 2000 years ago. Rather, we are getting ready for Jesus to be born once again, in our hearts, in our lives, in our world. God is coming.

How badly do we want him? That seems like a silly question. Who wouldn't want God? Yet maybe the answer is not as simple as we think.

Do we still want God - if it means that we have to forgive those who have hurt us the most? Do we still want God - if it means that we need to be incredibly generous with the poor and those in need, and not simply once in a while, but as a way of life? Do we still want God - if it means we need to be a people of peace and not violence, mercy and not revenge? Do we still want God - if it means we have to be faithful to our responsibilities, honest and diligent at work, patient with those who annoy us, understanding to those who are different from us, and compassionate to those who are hurting?

That beautiful babe born in Bethlehem, wants something as well. He wants to be reborn in us. God wants to come into our lives to change us, transform us, re-fashion us in the way he created us to be and died for us to be. That means that God has certain wants and expectations of us (if I can be so bold to use that kind of language about God). God wants us to forgive more. God wants us to love more. And so, in saying yes we truly want God; we are saying yes to so many other things; to a whole new way of seeing, acting and being.

Saint Nicholas

We celebrate the memorial of Saint Nicholas on Monday December 6th. He was bishop of Myra in the fourth century. He was a devout and holy man with a great hunger for the faith. His parents were wealthy, but they died while he was young during an epidemic. He was raised by his uncle, who was the Bishop of Patara.

Nicholas used some of his inheritance to supply a dowry for three daughters of a man who had really come into hard times. Anonymously, he threw a bag of coins through an open window on three different occasions, preventing these ladies from falling into prostitution.

Nicholas, by virtue of his generous gift giving, has become in legend this image of Santa Claus. He is patron of children, the unmarried women, brides, prostitutes, sailors, pawnbrokers, prisoners, perfumers, travelers, fishermen, poets, dock workers, brewers and bankers.

Instead of mailing him a list of all of our wants and desires for this holiday season, may we join with him in intercessory prayer for all of those groups of people. May we stand in solidarity with all of the suffering and marginalized and especially with all those in risk and in need ... and raise a glass of a cola soft drink in his honor.



The **2nd Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.


A GREAT BIG "TURKEY" THANK YOU!


