SACRAMENTS

St. Elizabeth will offer sacraments to active registered parishioners who have been a member for a minimum of six months.

Anyone wishing to join the parish may contact the parish office Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm by calling 610 – 266 - 0695 or stopping by.

Registration paperwork is a short one page form listing your current contact information and date of birth, as well as your sacramental records.

Once we receive your paperwork we will arrange a meeting with the pastor so he may get to know you.

LETTER OF GOOD STANDING

A letter of good standing shows that you are an active member of your church. Parishioners must have received the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation; be over the age of sixteen; if married, celebrated by Roman Catholic tradition. Please contact the parish office for more detail.

Letters are required for Godparents and Sponsors. Requests for a Letter of Good Standing will be processed within one week, provided parishioner sacramental information is on file with the parish office.

PASTOR'S CORNER

There are plenty of experts who will tell us how to live our lives in order to be comfortable, stress-free and successful. Jeremiah in our 1st reading tells us clearly that trusting in human wisdom is disaster waiting to happen. The only true trustworthy guide is God, who teaches us how to live. The contrast between trusting in human wisdom and following divine guidance is described as the difference between a barren bush and a stalwart tree. Like a bush dying in the desert heat, human wisdom is fruitless. Trusting in God endures like a majestic tree with deep roots and abundant fruit. The contrast is clear and profound. We need to choose.

The gospel from Luke also draws clear contrasts. Not only does Jesus articulate blessings to his followers, but he also warns about the woes that come to those who live according to the materialistic values of the world. The contrast is clear.

Considering Luke's beatitudes about the poor, the hungry, the weeping, and the hated, it's hard to see these folks as blessed. However, although they are suffering now, their beatitude will come later, and it will last. The reason for the final triumph is that they are suffering for their faith in Christ. In contrast, those who live lives focused on worldly affluence and success will end up lost. The world's values are short-lived and deceitful living with Christ lasts for all eternity.

Paul reminds the early Christians and us that through the salvation brought about by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we will enjoy eternal life. Because of it, the life of the human family has changed forever. In the midst of our daily lives, we need to remember and live in joy and hope.

At our baptism, we became members of the Body of Christ, and our Christian faith is the foundation of our lives. There is much in our world that can lead us astray from our commitment to Christ. We need each other and we need to come together to worship and to re-dedicate ourselves to the gospel. We need each other's good examples of fidelity. We need each other to keep our faith alive.

THINGS TO PONDER

Valentine

Monday is Saint Valentine's Day ... well, yes, also Saints Cyril and Methodius. It is the last day of National Marriage Week in the USA. The NationalMarriageWeekUSA.org website has an interesting one-page information sheet to outline the benefits of marriage for children and to reduce poverty. A commentary in Time Magazine from March of 2012 observed "We have launched highly effective public education campaigns on much less momentous issues, from smoking to recycling ... For now, the decline in marriage is our most ignored national crisis."

In 1970 married adults numbered 79%. In 2013 it was 57%. Boys without fathers are twice as likely to end up in prison. If the marriage rates today were those in 1970, we would have 25% less poverty. In the United States, marriage drops the probability of child poverty by 82%. In 1970, never married Americans numbered 21 million ... in 2012, the number was 77 million.

What can we do? Pray for the vocation of marriage. Promote and advocate for marriage within our circles of family and friends and within our community. Prosper within our own marriages ... seek ways to make them more dynamic and fruitful.


