PASTOR'S NOTES

Today we are asked to recognize, acknowledge, and have compassion for those we currently are not even noticing. People in our own little worlds who are completely invisible to us... not because they want to be, but because we simply aren't looking properly, aren't paying attention, aren't really that concerned with the needs of many people other than ourselves. I know there are many Lazarus' among my family, friends, and parishioners. And I know that some of them I am simply walking past, ignoring, disregarding; and might not even be aware of it. They are invisible to me because of the blindness of my own sin.

If we believe the passage we just heard; if we believe the truth in Jesus' words; then this sort of neglect, this sort of indifference, this sort of blindness is much more sinful than we might imagine. When we simply fail to notice and respond to the needs of those in our midst; those right in front of us; we might be disappointing God in ways we can't imagine and we too, by our actions or inactions, may end up paying the ultimate price as did the rich man in the gospel.

And so, if we want to be faithful, if we want to please God, if we want to live lives in imitation of Jesus, then we must open our eyes and pay attention to the invisible people right in our midst. The ones who are hurting and for whom no one seems to care. Who might these people be? Maybe a widowed neighbor who is terribly lonely. Maybe it's a co-worker or fellow student who feels he or she doesn't really fit in (and who often gets excluded from social activities). Maybe it is the spouse who needs nothing more than to feel wanted, desired, respected, appreciated. Maybe it's a child who feels his or her parents play favorites. Maybe it's an elderly parent who is placed in a home and rarely visited. Maybe it's a friend who is going through a divorce and needs someone to lend a compassionate, non-judgmental ear. Maybe it's a person you have judged and convicted as no good, based on something that happened a long time ago, and you have no problem talking about them and throwing an invisibility cloak over them as if their existence doesn't matter. Or maybe it is a whole group of people; any minority or marginalized group that struggles simply to be treated with the same respect and have the same opportunities as people in the majority.

And lying at his door, and our door, was a poor man named Lazarus.

Who are our Lazarus? Who is invisible to us? And more importantly, what are we going to do about it? Perhaps...we open our eyes and our ears and our hearts and perhaps...we swallow our pride and our prejudice and perhaps...we act while there still is time.




