Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

ADVENT



Advent is the period of preparation for the coming of the birth of Jesus at Christmas and a preparation for the second coming of Christ. The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. The rose or pink candle which we light on the Advent Wreath is also called the Shepherd Candle which reflects the joy that comes through Jesus' arrival, and through the salvation He has gifted us.

WRITINGS FROM DEACON

What are you expecting? When Jesus was born, the expectation of the people was that a great king would come in triumph to defeat the oppression of the Romans. Who wouldn't want that? Moses had secured the release of the people from the control of the Egyptians. Would not the new king effect an even greater victory in his day?

In today's gospel, John the Baptist sent his disciples to Jesus to ask if He was the one who is to come. Jesus told them to report back what it was that they were seeing. The blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised and the poor hear the good news proclaimed to them. This freedom from oppression and misery as announced by the prophet Isaiah was not military and political, but rather a personal restoration of dignity.

As Jesus said of John, if you were looking for someone in fine clothing, look beyond to see the greatest of prophets, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

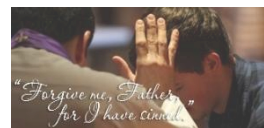
SCRUMPTIOUS PARISH BREAKFAST!

ST. ELIZABETH CHURCH NEW ADDITION

Many of you might have noticed the newest statue that has been placed in the church, our newest Saint – Carlo Acutis, who was canonized on September 7, 2025.

Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991, in London. Just a few months later, he moved with his parents, Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano, to Milan, Italy.



- Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia as a teenager. Before his death in 2006, he offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying: “I offer all of my suffering to the Lord for the pope and for the Church in order not to go to purgatory but to go straight to heaven.”
- From an early age, Carlo had a special love for God, even though his parents weren’t especially devout. Antonia Salzano, his mom, said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her First Communion, her Confirmation, and her wedding. As a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his First Communion, he went to Mass as often as possible at the parish across from his elementary school. Carlo’s love for the Eucharist inspired a deep conversion for his mother.
- Carlo was a faithful friend. He was known for standing up for kids at school who got bullied, especially kids with disabilities.
- Carlo was fascinated with computer coding and taught himself some of the basic coding languages, including C and C++. Carlo loved playing video games. His mother recalls that he liked Nintendo Game Boy and GameCube as well as PlayStation and Xbox. He had conversations with his gaming buddies about the importance of going to Mass, confession and limited his video game playing to two hours per week. Carlo also liked Spider-Man and Pokémon.
- Carlo died on Oct. 12, 2006, and was buried in Assisi, Italy.

Endowment for Care of Retired Priests

When a Diocesan priest is ordained, he makes a lifelong commitment to serve the needs of the faithful in the Diocese of Allentown. In return, the Diocese makes a commitment to the priest to provide for his basic well-being during his lifetime, including retirement. The normal retirement age for a priest in our Diocese is 75. Retirement costs including insurance, healthcare, prescription drugs, skilled nursing care, and housing and sustenance continue to escalate. At present, approximately one-third of Diocesan priests are retired. The Diocese of Allentown currently pays for the retirement needs of priests through the *Because We are Catholic Annual Appeal* and the Diocesan operating budget. Due to the ever-increasing costs of care, which now exceed \$2.7 million per year, the Diocese has created this Endowment Fund as an additional source of funding to cover these expenses in the future.
