Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

ADVENT

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the “Angel’s Candle,” symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: “Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.”



WRITINGS FROM DEACON

Joseph is described in today’s gospel as a righteous man. This means that he holds in high regard justice for himself and for those with whom he interacts for the glory of God. The law of God is in his heart, and the judgement of God is ever before him. The law is very explicit in the circumstances in which he finds himself in this passage. He had a tendency toward mercy in the case of his betrothed. Joseph had planned to divorce Mary quietly and discreetly. This shows precisely what righteousness entails. Justice and mercy are both elements of this virtue. Excessive harshness and excessive tenderness are both antithetical to this virtue. In his dream, the path for him became clear. May we all be open to the path for us in our own dealings.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD – HOUSE BLESSING

The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. According to Austrian theologian Pius Parsch “The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is his, and government and power.” With these words the Church proclaims that the feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of Advent. Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season.



The blessing of homes, on whose lintels are inscribed with blessed chalk the Cross of salvation, together with the indication of the year and the initials of the three wise men (20+C+M+B+26), Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar which can also be interpreted to mean Christus Mansionem Benedicat, (Christ Bless this House) written in blessed chalk. This custom, often accompanied by processions of children with their parents, expresses the blessing of Christ through the intercession of the three wise men and is an occasion for gathering offerings for charitable and missionary purposes. We will have house blessing packets available at all the exits of the church on the weekend of the Epiphany, Jan 6th. Packets will be available starting December 31st in the church.
