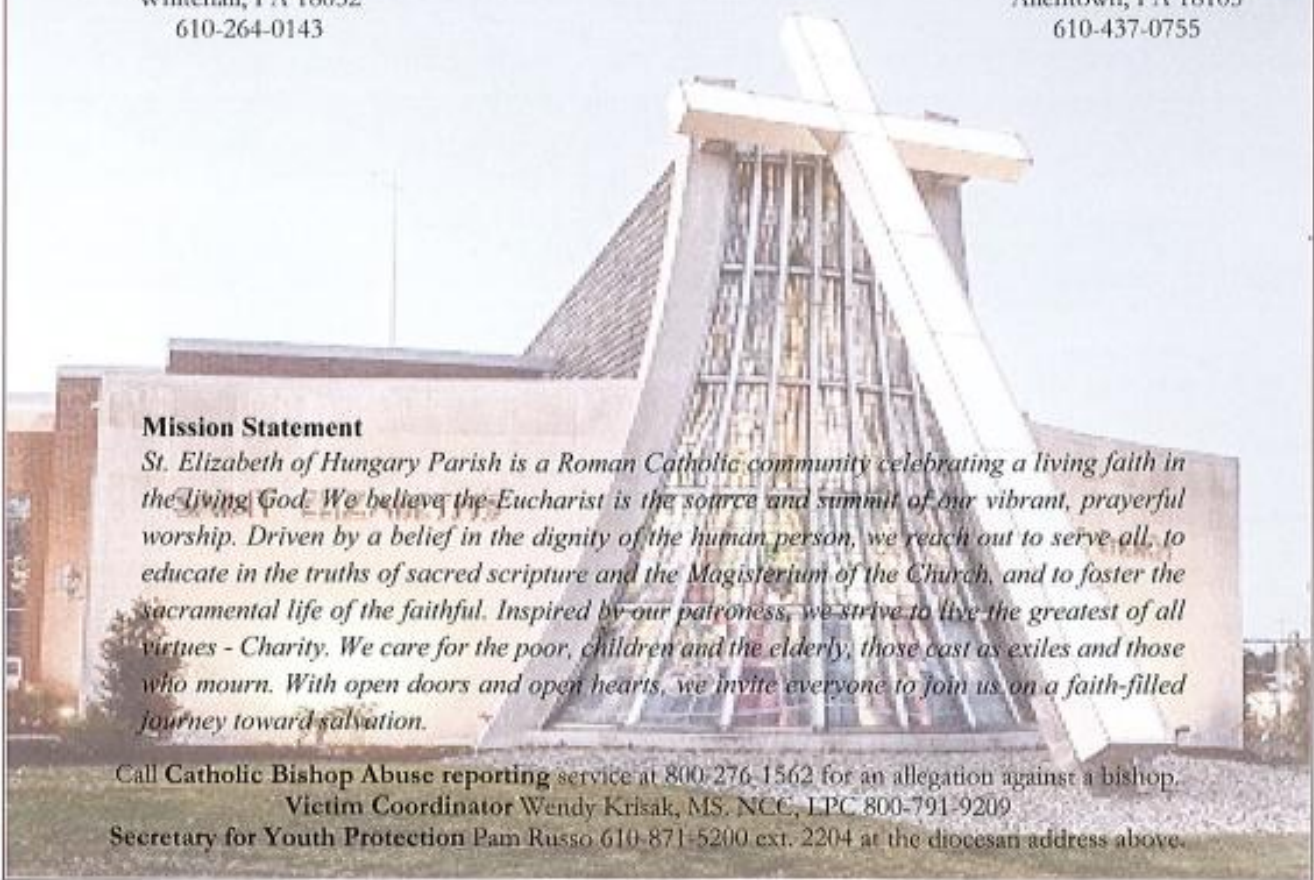

PARISH NEWS

(Mt. 3:13-17). **Jesus along the Jordan**

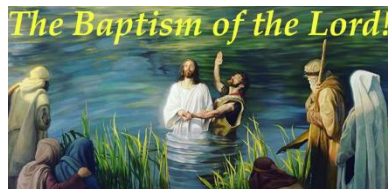
The Gospel passage begins with a geographical annotation: Jesus goes from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John the Baptist. On His arrival, Jesus does not declare Himself to be the Messiah, He does not preach. Instead, He stands with everyone else there, wanting to be baptized, thus manifesting his solidarity with the sinful people. Jesus does not isolate Himself, but He goes out among the people, even those marked by the wounds of sin. He puts Himself at risk by being with them, just as He put Himself at risk by becoming Man in the womb of Mary. There is, therefore, a consistent design in how Jesus “moves about” along His “itinerary of salvation”. John the Baptist says, “*I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?*” on seeing Jesus.

WRITINGS FROM DEACON

The synoptic gospel accounts of the baptism of Jesus describe the opening of the heavens along with the descent of the Holy Spirit. The voice of the Father follows by acknowledging his Son in whom he is well pleased. The Father’s voice is an affirmation of Jesus and His role in the work of salvation.

This baptism presents to our sinful world the need for His redeeming action. In the Jordan, this baptism would seem unnecessary as Jesus is sinless yet manifests His solidarity with sinful humanity and his desire to take upon himself our guilt.

This baptismal event reminds us of our own baptism when we were named, claimed, and affirmed. When we dip our hand into the holy water, we recall our baptism into Christ into his death and resurrection. We reclaim this unmerited gift with the promise of life and hope. The hope that heaven is open for us.



SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

On one occasion, I humorously remarked to Fr. Joe that the school reminded me of a minor seminary.

Apart from the well-organized choir, I was also impressed by the efforts of the Religious Education department. Participating in the 'spiritual gatherings' was truly remarkable; I was particularly impressed by the Christian initiation for adults, in which sponsors also participated. This was completely new and noteworthy. Then, I was pleased with the spiritual lecture on the Jewish roots of Christmas. It was heartwarming that people have the chance to learn more about their faith. Thirdly, there was the session designed for parents of students. I had never seen anything like it, where parents come to learn more about the faith. All of this reflects a faith that is vibrant and taking root. I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the excellent work done by Mary Spieker.

I am grateful for the chance to witness the *sensus fidei* of the people. It was a joy to see that faith is still thriving. I also appreciate the kindness and generosity shown to me. Of course, I was happy to experience the snowfall, even though I didn't get a chance to make snowballs. I must say that my time here was truly enjoyable, and I would be glad to return someday.
