Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

ST. ELIZABETH CHURCH HISTORY

This year we will highlight a Saint depicted on our stained-glass window each month. In November we have our patron St. Elizabeth of Hungary. An informational pamphlet was placed on his window shelf. The information will also be posted to the church website under Parish History for those interested.

WRITINGS FROM DEACON

This past Sunday we learned that we in the Church are living stones. We are built up as the City of God, as the Body of Christ. As temples of the Holy Spirit, we are called to be holy in our person and as Church.

The gospel today has Jesus describing the day when the Temple in Jerusalem would be destroyed. In fact, the Romans only a few decades later reduced the Temple so that not a stone would be left on another stone. Jesus calls upon us to have faith and trust. As living stones built upon Him and in Him, we cannot be destroyed. He speaks of earthquakes, plagues, famine, and war. Our parish family has experienced these things. Only a few weeks after our parish was established, the bombing of Pearl Harbor occurred. Korea, Vietnam, and the Middle East are frightening memories. The plague-like fear of Covid in recent memory was disturbing. Throughout the world many are persecuted for their faith. Many are hated and put to death because of the name of Jesus. Perseverance in faith and trust in Him will secure our lives.



SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

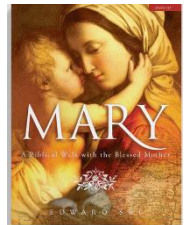

Endowment for Care of Retired Priests

When a Diocesan priest is ordained, he makes a lifelong commitment to serve the needs of the faithful in the Diocese of Allentown. In return, the Diocese makes a commitment to the priest to provide for his basic well-being during his lifetime, including retirement. The normal retirement age for a priest in our Diocese is 75. Retirement costs including insurance, healthcare, prescription drugs, skilled nursing care, and housing and sustenance continue to escalate. At present, approximately one-third of Diocesan priests are retired. The Diocese of Allentown currently pays for the retirement needs of priests through the *Because We are Catholic Annual Appeal* and the Diocesan operating budget. Due to the ever-increasing costs of care, which now exceed \$2.7 million per year, the Diocese has created this Endowment Fund as an additional source of funding to cover these expenses in the future.

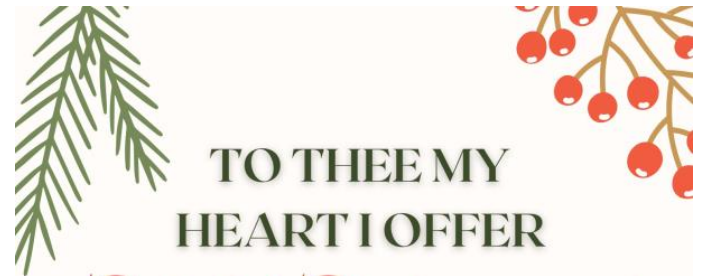
