DEACON WRITING

“Is it better like this or like this?” In an eye exam we hear this question maybe a dozen times. We are invited to contrast between two perspectives as to which appears clearer. In today’s readings it is the divine physician at work. The plan of God is placed before so many. He is making His power and will present in the world and inviting us to share His perspective.

Standing in front of Samuel, surely it would be the tallest, strongest and sleekest of the sons of Jesse who should be anointed king. Still, none of the seven sons would be chosen by the Lord. It was the youngest whom the Lord intended to be king.

In the gospel, the man born blind was made to see. The Pharisees were not as amazed that the miracle had occurred as that it was done by unapproved work on the sabbath. They had the real vision problem. They weren’t living up to their name as Pharisees.

We should ask for the Lord’s vision. We should desire to see need and hurt, yet also to see hope and mercy.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact the Pastor at the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; this is the preferred contact method, please do not pass messages through others.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.
