### DEACON'S WRITING

Jesus heard that Lazarus was ill. He said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Jesus did not immediately rush with urgency to Judea. It wasn't until two days later that He said to His disciples that Lazarus was asleep and that He would awaken him. Jesus then made it clear that Lazarus had died.

Through it all, Jesus was assuring His disciples that Lazarus would be raised from the dead. Still, when Jesus met up with Mary and the weeping mourners, He became perturbed and HE WEPT. Jesus has the power to heal. He has power over disease and death. He has compassion. He understands, experiences and embraces our grief and suffering in all things.

We can be confident of His closeness and participation in all our distress at all times even as He imparts grace and healing in the little things along with all major pain and suffering in our lives. He is present. He is ready to walk with us to defeat sin and death.

## SACRAMENTS

*New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.*

### BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

### FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

### CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

### MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

### PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

**Contact the Pastor at the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick;** this is the preferred contact method, please do not pass messages through others.

### FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

### PARISH FACTS FOR THE CURIOUS

The church roof was replaced in the 1990's when Msgr. Muntone was Pastor. It has been patched several times over the years and the one small section over the usher's closet has been replaced in the last five years. The roof "skin" looks like worn gauze on the main sections of the church. The carpet, which still looks good, is from the late 1990's/early 2000's and is now a tripping hazard, because it cannot be stretched, a code violation for our insurance.

The parish hall was renovated in approximately 1995 by placing carpet on the walls, and floor tile over the existing asbestos floor. Placing the flooring on top of the existing floor raised it enough that it causes the pull-down cafeteria tables to catch or pinch fingers when pulled out. Parish hall bathrooms were done at the same time. The large windows in the hall foyer are not tempered glass, another insurance code violation.

School windows had storm windows placed over the older windows to help with heating and drafts in the 1980's when Sr. Helen Ann Sharkey was principal.

Air-conditioning units were installed in classrooms in the late 1990's by Sr. Bonita Smith. Second floor asbestos was removed in 2024, now we have to do the first floor.

The Annex building was turned into a day care in the mid-1980's and an apartment on the second floor was created for Sr. Helen.

For many of us that seems like yesterday. However, even in the days when things lasted a good long time, thirty plus years, is the average lifetime of roofs, windows and carpet.
