DEACON'S WRITING

As we enter Holy Week, so many events and emotions strike us. We are humbled and overwhelmed by the sacrifice our Lord endured for us. We are at first elated at His triumphant entry into Jerusalem. This promise of the renewal of the kingdom of David energized and excited those who welcomed Him into the city. So quickly circumstances and the people turned against Him. What followed were moments and sufferings on our behalf at a time and place with eternal impact.

What about our time and place? We were not present at the cross 2000 years ago. Jesus is present to us even now. So many people are suffering and sacrificing. Great numbers of people endure their own crosses. Can we today be like Simon of Cyrene and help to carry the cross for others? Are we able to offer our veil to wipe the sweat from our neighbors? Should we help to ease suffering of those around us ... to take them down from their cross ... like Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea?

What we do for the least of these; we do for Him. When we recognize Christ in others and act like Christ for others, we are truly one.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact the Pastor at the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; this is the preferred contact method, please do not pass messages through others.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

PARISH UPDATES

Church Roof – as many of you know the roof materials arrived in two deliveries. The second delivery was due to the bad weather when we had with a hint of tornadoes....fortunately we did not have a tornado at St. E.

The roof will take three to four weeks to complete now that it has started.

Over the last twenty years the roof has been patched and re-patched, and the one section over the Usher's closet was replaced within the last two years. Now we can stop the leaks we have been chasing.

Church Carpet – which is an insurance requirement will be installed after the roof is completed and we ensure that the leaking roof will not ruin the new carpet.

Baptismal Symbols – are courtesy of Stephanie MacKewen our Seventh Grade teacher who created and placed the stencils on the interior doors of the church to represent the Sacrament of Baptism in the church foyer. Thank you Stephanie!

School – a few windows were replaced at the school because they were easily done even with the students still in school.

- The student bathroom windows are now tempered, frosted glass with a tilt in window. Our students can now use the bathroom with some privacy, and without fear of a large piece of glass hurting them if the window happens to break.
- The corridor between the parish hall and school has new windows to replace the warped, badly caulked, split pane windows that held no insulation and honestly were embarrassing.

Annex – in the 1980's the majority of the windows in the front and sides of that building were replaced however the rear porches had the original windows from when the building was built. The windows started warping and leaking over the last five years. To preserve the heat and prevent water damage those windows are being replaced.
