DEACON'S WRITING

The doors were locked since the disciples were fearful. At the direction of the Jews, the Romans had put Jesus to a terrible death. Now, Jesus was standing in their midst. He said, "Peace be with you." Jesus would have also said, "Shalom" which means hello or goodbye. It means no conflict or discord. It means safety, health, contentment and holiness. Coming from the mouth of the one who had died and was now in their presence alive and well must have truly impressed upon them the deeper meaning of this greeting. The serenity and confidence would impart the fullness of hope.

Jesus again said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father, has sent me, so I send you." This is an essential mandate. The first mandate at the Last Supper was a charge of service. In this message, the apostles and we ourselves are sent to reveal the love that the Father prizes above all else.

Jesus is the Word of God. He is the love of God and exemplifies it for all to see. We are to now embody the unselfish love of the Father and the Son to heal, liberate and comfort that others may share in the resurrection peace and joy.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact the Pastor at the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; this is the preferred contact method, please do not pass messages through others.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

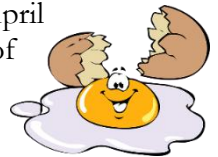
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

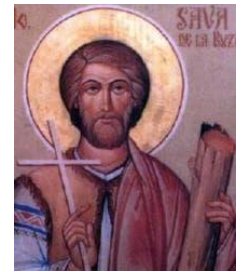

LECTOR BLESSING

On the weekend of April 11 – 12 the lectors will receive a blessing from the celebrant and will be asked to stand during Mass. We also ask that the Lectors stop in the Sacristy before Masses. It is the feast day of St. Sabas, the patron saint of Lectors.

Saint Sabas the Lector, also known as Sabas the Goth, was a remarkable figure in the early centuries of Christianity. Born in the year 334 in an area of modern Wallachia, Romania, he would go on to become a courageous and devout martyr for his faith. Saint Sabas led a life dedicated to the service of God from an early age. He was known as a lector in a church, a position held in high regard within the Christian community.



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 12

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary Rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by an opening prayer from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska and followed by a closing prayer.

St. Faustina's Prayer for Sinners O Jesus, eternal Truth, our Life, I call upon You and I beg Your mercy for poor sinners. O sweetest Heart of my Lord, full of pity and unfathomable mercy, I plead with You for poor sinners. O Most Sacred Heart, Fount of Mercy from which gush forth rays of inconceivable graces upon the entire human race, I beg of You light for poor sinners. O Jesus, be mindful of Your own bitter Passion and do not permit the loss of souls redeemed at so dear a price of Your most precious Blood. O Jesus, when I consider the great price of Your Blood, I rejoice at its immensity, for one drop alone would have been enough for the salvation of all sinners. Although sin is an abyss of wickedness and ingratitude, the price paid for us can never be equaled. Therefore, let every soul trust in the Passion of the Lord, and place its hope in His mercy. God will not deny His mercy to anyone. Heaven and earth may change, but God's mercy will never be exhausted. Oh, what immense joy burns in my heart when I contemplate Your incomprehensible goodness, O Jesus! I desire to bring all sinners to Your feet that they may glorify Your mercy throughout endless ages (*Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, 72).



Closing Prayer - Eternal God, in Whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

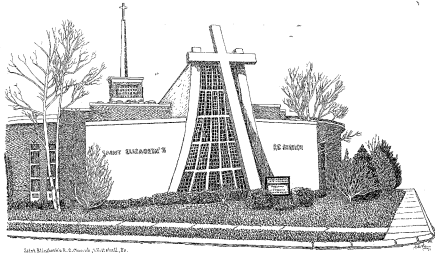
