ASCENSION THURSDAY – HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION, MAY 14TH



Forty days after His resurrection from the dead, Christ ascended into heaven. Christ's ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain. Jesus, as the head of the Church, preceded us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of His Body, may live in the hope of one day being with Him forever. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

DEACON'S WRITING

Jesus says in today's gospel, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ...Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me." At one point, Jesus gave the disciples a pointed example of the commandment of love in service to another. He, the master, washed the feet of His followers. One would betray Him. One would deny Him for a time. Most would abandon Him in fear for a time. He demonstrated what the character of love is by the witness of His actions.

Today is Mother's Day. In many ways, we can see that type of love in service lived in the vocation of motherhood. The washing of the feet ... yes and more. It can be a challenge ... the Terrible Two's ... the Teen years ... at any point between and beyond. Mom can do it ... we should too.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST EUCHARIST/ PENANCE:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact the Pastor at the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; this is the preferred contact method, please do not pass messages through others.

FUNERAL:

For the passing of a Loved one please contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral Director will contact the church to arrange a date and time for the service. Funerals are held on weekdays.

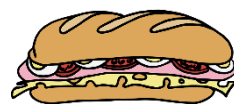
TOGETHER FOR TOMORROW RAFFLE

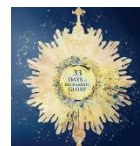
HOAGIE FUNDRAISER

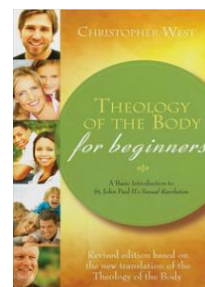
OUR BASKET SOCIAL IS 6 MONTHS AWAY!

Over the past several months we have been discussing the upcoming projects that will help improve our parish. This week during Mass we reviewed the case statement and goals of the campaign. You will receive more information in the mail about the campaign this week if you have not already received it. Please reflect on the information and consider how you can support our campaign. Next weekend, as an entire parish, we will spend a few minutes making our pledge. Our hope is to have every family make a pledge to the campaign. Together we will continue to maintain God's house to enrich our parish.

The Finance Committee assessed the total needs of the projects in our parish and have come up with a goal of \$1,300,000. Our hope is to raise these funds over the next 3 years. With the help of each family, we can exceed our goal.

As your family prays and reflects on the level of their gift, please know that no one can tell another what to give but many families do ask for a guideline. Therefore, a 'Guideline to Giving' is available. This information will also be found in the campaign brochure you will receive in the mail this week. When deciding how much to give to the capital campaign, many parishioners have also found it helpful to start their thinking at giving 'one dollar per week per one-thousand dollars of annual household income'. In other words, if you make \$50,000 per year, consider \$50 per week, \$80,000 per year consider \$80 per week and so on. Please also remember that your capital gift is over and above whatever you contribute weekly or monthly now to the offertory collection.

Please bring your pledge card back to next weekend's Mass. The Finance Committee will be able to share more about our progress and the details of the capital improvements in coming weeks.
