Rituals & Traditions #1

ADVENT

Advent is the period of preparation for the coming of the birth of Jesus at Christmas and a preparation for the second coming of Christ. On each of the four Sundays in Advent, a candle on the Advent wreath is lit, each representing specific virtues of hope, love, joy, and peace.



The first candle, which is purple, **symbolizes hope**. It is sometimes called the “Prophesy Candle” in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

PASTOR'S NOTES

We are now entering into our own time of preparation, the season of Advent. We know it is a time to prepare for Christmas. Many have already gone shopping for gifts, put up decorations, and began baking in anticipation. Yet Advent is more than this. Advent is a time for us to prepare not only for a Holy Day but for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in ways that are greatly anticipated; and in ways that can often be overlooked.

The Gospel tells of the coming of the Son of Man. It will be an event that will take many people by surprise like the flood involving Noah in the book of Genesis. Jesus does not want his disciples to be surprised; he wants them to be prepared. In all likelihood, Jesus was warning his disciples of the coming destruction of Jerusalem that he knew was coming. Jewish nationalism would bring destruction unless the people repented and listened to him. Jesus' disciples would be prepared or as he put it, 'stay awake' so that they may flee this coming catastrophe.

Advent is a time to prepare for coming catastrophes. Is our faith strong enough to handle the loss of property, the loss of income, the loss of health, or even the loss of a loved one? These are questions we should be seriously asking ourselves. Even if we feel we are ready, we still need to reinforce our faith so that we can be ready not only for ourselves but for others who will need us to help them through. Being prepared is a task for everyone who desires to follow Jesus.

We know the outcome between good and evil, the victory of Christ. Our task is to ensure that we are on the victorious side by living lives worthy of him. We ought not take eternal life for granted, but, each day, renew our commitment to the gospel and the hope that our baptism offers. As Christians, we are called to be realistic, to face the fact that our world is broken and in need of healing. Yet we are never without hope. Indeed, the Christian view is to see worldly imperfection not as a lost cause, but as an opportunity for improvement and redemption. This is what we celebrate in the Advent time of preparation and anticipation. We look forward to the coming of Christ, striving to be vigilant and worthy to stand before the Son of Man.

DEACON'S THOUGHTS

Wednesday, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Andrew. In the Gospel reading, we hear of the call of Saints Peter and Andrew and of Saints James and John. In our culture, there seems to be a conflation of the terms vocation and occupation. For the most part, occupation is understood as your means of making a living. You may be a teacher or a physician or an engineer. A vocation is a calling. If you are a telemarketer, calling may be involved but that is not a vocation.

What is your calling? What is your vocation? Unlike Saint Andrew, it is not to have a world-famous golf course named after you. Very much like Saint Andrew, your vocation IS to be holy. Your vocation IS to be a saint. Simon and Andrew, James and John did not have the day-to-day process and agenda presented to them when they received the call from Jesus. They did, without hesitation or reservation, leave everything behind to follow the Lord. Would they have concerns as to how this would all work out? I am sure.

Embrace your vocation and live it well. If you are called to be the father of six children, or the mother of no children, or to consecrated religious life, or called to a life of single service, or to holy orders, or called to marriage, live your vocation well.

Your vocation, in all things is to be holy ... to be a saint. Your vocation has a dimension like that of Andrew. James and John, Simon and Andrew were called by the Lord WITH their brothers. We also must work with our spouses and our children to be holy, to help our brothers and sisters, our parents and grandparents, our godchildren. We must be examples to the world of that universal call to holiness, to our friends and coworkers, to our electricians and plumbers, to our mechanics ... and telemarketers. What is your vocation?

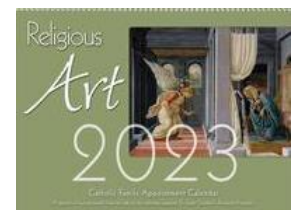
SHARE THE JOY THIS CHRISTMAS!
