#### PASTOR'S NOTES

Every day of our lives—indeed, every minute of every day—we have choices to make. Those choices, no matter how insignificant they may seem, shape our character either for better or for worse. And the consequences of those actions also add up to our benefit or our detriment. As we heard in our first reading from the book of Sirach: "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." Every decision we make is important. Every course of action we take determines in what direction our life will be headed.

Jesus speaks to this in today's Gospel passage. Sinfulness consists not just in breaking the commandments. Rather it is rooted in the decisions we make and in our thoughts and desires which, though hidden to others, are made plain to the eyes of God.

Jesus teaches us that not just the actions we take but the thoughts we think are the result of decisions we make. Although thoughts can pop into our minds at any time, we can choose which thoughts we will welcome and which we will dismiss. It requires much discipline for us to be aware of what we are thinking and to change the direction of those thoughts before they take us down the wrong road. But such discipline is vital if we are to keep God's word and learn to love our neighbor from our heart.

The good news is that we do not need to do this alone. While no human can read our thoughts or see into our hearts, God can. His Holy Spirit scrutinizes all things as Saint Paul tells us in this Sunday's second reading. He can make us aware of thoughts and feelings which are causing bitterness and anger to well up within us. And he can guide our minds to thoughts of joy, peace, and love. We need only commit ourselves to spending some quiet time in prayer daily asking the Spirit to guard and guide our thoughts and feelings. Then we will experience an inner transformation and inner peace because the burden of grudges and long-guarded jealousies will be lifted from us and our hearts will be free to love.

The following quote has been attributed to the American philosopher, Ralph Waldo Emerson: "Watch your thoughts. They become words. Watch your words. They become deeds. Watch your deeds. They become habits. Watch your habits. They become character. Character is everything."

Each of us has choices to make. How we choose will determine what kind of person we become and how our lives will turn out. If we are not happy with the direction our lives have taken to this point, there is always time for us to change course. The first step is to put our lives in God's hands and give him control over the decisions we make. If we ask him to, he will transform us, beginning with the small choices we make. Then our crooked ways will be made straight, and our bumpy paths made smooth.

#### **DEACON'S THOUGHTS**

Last week we were so distressed by a balloon drifting over our nation. When we as children have a balloon get out of our control it is totally at the mercy of the wind. The claim that this was an errant balloon exclusively for weather research has been questioned. Google has had several helium balloons in service for a number of years. The Google balloons are surprisingly maneuverable by making modest adjustments in altitude to make use of variations in wind currents. These craft can maintain a relatively constant position for a significant period of time or transit great distances.

The balloon in question seemed to be positioned in sensitive locations significant in our defense systems. At some sixty thousand feet, surveillance capability would likely exceed that of satellites. Would we have things and facilities that we would really not wish to be known and observed, particularly by an entity that we would consider hostile?

And yet we do in fact have many matters which we would truly not wish to be known by some whom we would consider to be caring and supportive. We may feel embarrassment by some elements of our life if they were known to a parent, a spouse, a sibling, a child.

We may especially prefer those things or thoughts or behaviors not to be known to God. He is not infinitely far away, nor in low earth orbit, nor at sixty thousand feet ... He is closer to us than we are to ourselves. He is around us. He is in us. He is loving, nurturing, caring and supportive. He is forgiving and merciful. As we grow in intimacy with God, we can grow in mercy toward others. We can become an even more effective image of God to our spouse, our siblings, our children, our parents, our neighbors. As persons, we are more genuine when we reveal compassion ... when we reveal Christ to others ...when we allow Christ to reveal himself to us ... when we allow him to reveal us to ourselves.


