#### PASTOR'S NOTES

St. Paul knew that words themselves could not contain the fullness of the Christian message, nor could words alone persuade others to make Jesus the Lord of Life.

For St. Paul, his words might have been able to change someone's mind, but it would be his action and that of other followers of Christ that would have the power to change hearts. What people would be attracted to and ultimately moved by was the manifestation of the Spirit within him, his light shining for all the world to see.

Our actions need not be attached to anything else. In fact, using them as a means to something might actually have the opposite effect. Our actions stand on their own, and they, to a large extent, speak for themselves. They say more than we realize or could ever imagine.

I'm convinced that the best way to assure someone that God can fill their heart with joy is to be a joyful person. And if you want someone to understand how much God loves them, love them unconditionally. If you want someone to trust in the promises of Christ, be hopeful amid life's difficulties. And if you want to trust deeply that the Lord died to reconcile every person to the Father, be a forgiving person. It's possible that there may come a time when you will have the opportunity to tell someone what it is like to live as a new creation, as someone transformed by the Holy Spirit. But every time, every second is an opportunity to show them that loving, merciful, generous person Jesus died and rose for us to be.

And there's an added blessing in all of this. When we perform acts of goodness for others, we don't simply change them and their circumstances. We also change ourselves. Isaiah teaches us that in the first reading we heard. 'If you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday'.

When we allow our light to 'shine before others', when we let the spirit within us shape how we treat each person we meet, God's light will grow even stronger within us, burn even brighter. The gifts that God showers upon us, and invites us to share with others, will never run out.

I said earlier that actions need not be attached to anything else and that is true. But it's important that our actions be attached to someone else. May the light of our actions flow from the one who is light and illuminate for others the love and compassion of our God. Before anything else, let all our actions tell the whole world how wonderful our God truly is.

#### **DEACON'S THOUGHTS**

This excerpt from a homily on Genesis 22 (Hom. 8,6 8. 9: PG 12, 206-209) by Origen speaks of Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac on Mount Moriah. It illustrates the spiritual exegesis of the Old Testament whereby the ram and Isaac are seen as s figures or types of Jesus Christ and Abraham is seen as a type of God the Father. It is used in the Roman Catholic Divine Office of Readings for Tuesday in the Fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) week of ordinary time.

Abraham took wood for the burnt offering and placed it upon Isaac his son, and he took fire and a sword in his hands, and together they went off. Isaac himself carries the wood for his own holocaust: this is a figure of Christ. For he bore the burden of the cross, and yet to carry the wood for the holocaust is really the duty of the priest. He is then both victim and priest. This is the meaning of the expression: together they went off. For when Abraham, who was to perform the sacrifice, carried the fire and the knife, Isaac did not walk behind him, but with him. In this way he showed that he exercised the priesthood equally with Abraham.

What happens after this? Isaac said to Abraham his father: Father. This plea from the son was at that instant the voice of temptation. For do you not think the voice of the son who was about to be sacrificed struck a responsive chord in the heart of the father? Although Abraham did not waver because of his faith, he responded with a voice full of affection and asked: What is it, my son? Isaac answered him: Here are the fire and the wood, but where is the sheep for the holocaust? And Abraham replied: God will provide for himself a sheep for the holocaust, my son. The careful yet loving response of Abraham moves me greatly. I do not know what he saw in spirit, because he did not speak of the present but of the future: God will provide for himself a sheep. His reply concerns the future, yet his son inquires about the present. Indeed, the Lord himself provided a sheep for himself in Christ.

In this teaching, we see a presentation of a foreshadowing in type of Jesus as priest and sacrifice. In distress and anguish, still he followed in faith. The ultimate sacrifice was not the ram in the brush. The sacrifice was the Lord himself.

During the 1800's, both the Sacred

Congregation for the Rites and the Holy Office issued various determinations concerning religious items. Here are a few examples: A chalice which becomes "unserviceable" is not to be sold, but must be used for some other sacred purpose, or melted. Vestments, etc. must be destroyed. Palms are to be burned, and the ashes then used for distribution on Ash Wednesday or returned to the ground. In all, the underlying idea is that what has been dedicated to God should be returned to God, in a sense, the same way a person's dead body is committed to the earth. Never should one just "throw out" what has been dedicated to God.

Therefore, the normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried.
