

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



We all are walking on our individual journeys through life dealing with many questions that arise, either by ourselves or with others. Sometimes it is difficult to deal with our questions. Sometimes our questions are difficult. Sometimes our difficulties cause us to question. Many times, we ask: "Where is God in all of this?"

In the Gospel we find the disciples at first failing to recognize Jesus and in the end, they recognize Him. What happened? Why did they at first think He was a stranger? Then, later come to realize who He really was.

What seems to be controlling this question of how we see people? Obviously, we re not talking here about simply seeing with our eyes, we re talking, rather, about seeing with our hearts. We are dealing with seeing at deeper levels of knowing and understanding. That s something we all know about. For instance, recall how you saw and understood your parents when you were a child. Then think about how you saw your parents when you were a teenager. The way you saw them changed, didn't it? Now think about how you as an adult see and know and understand your parents. It s hugely different, isn't it?

What changed? Did they change, or did you change? I think we all immediately know it is we who changed, not our parents. Their love, care, and concern for us remained constant. It was our acceptance of their love, care, and concern that went through different stages. It was the way we saw them that changed. And maybe the way we see them even now is still changing.

Isn't that likewise true with others whom you love? I think it was also true with the Jesus' disciples. The disciples walking on the road to Emmaus were talking about all of the stupendous events that had occurred surrounding the crucifixion and death of Jesus. They were terribly upset because they had thought Jesus of Nazareth was the Messiah that God had sent and look what had happened! They were dazed and bewildered by it all; they were trying to make sense out of it all. Where was God in all of this, they wondered?

The Gospel account then takes us to the one thing that opened their eyes, the event that allowed them to make all the connections, the central piece in the puzzle that opened their eyes. It was the breaking of the bread. The critical thing that occurred was when the Stranger" who was among them took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them to eat. Suddenly their eyes of recognition were opened. They no longer saw Him with just their eyes, but they recognized Him with their hearts. They saw Him with their newly awakened faith. They recognized Him because they encountered Him in a totally different light. They saw Him now in that event where He promised to be with them always. Knowledge, you see, isn't based simply on the acquisition of facts, information, and data. True knowledge is seeing things based on wisdom and understanding, gifts of the Holy Spirit. Jesus comes to you and me in ways we least expect. May we open our hearts to truly recognize His presence. God bless you. Fr. Stan

SACRAMENTS

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Parents may contact the parish office as soon as they lean that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least 2 months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least 2 years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least 2 years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.


