

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The first line from today's second reading from first Peter is one which should immediately catch our attention. 'Beloved: Rejoice to the extent that you share in the sufferings of Christ'.

Although this seems like a nearly impossible request to live out, Peter seems to be specifically addressing a particular kind of suffering - one which arises simply when we strive to do the right thing, when we try to live out our calling as followers of Jesus.

If you are insulted for the name of Jesus, blessed are you.' In the time of Peter, one's life could be in jeopardy just for admitting one was a disciple of Jesus. Sadly, in some parts of the world it is still that way. But this same idea applies more broadly for the consequences that sometimes arise each and every time we choose to act kindly, generously, justly, and lovingly. We only have to look at the cross to know that sometimes, just doing the right thing - the loving thing - can cause us to experience a great deal of sorrow, disappointment, and pain.

But does this mean we can and should rejoice? What could possibly bring us joy in the midst of our suffering? Maybe by helping us recognize the courage it took for Jesus to walk the path He did. Maybe by helping us realize just how much Jesus loves us. Maybe by helping us draw some comfort from knowing that we are in a small way imitating our Lord - the One who shows us what a holy and authentic life looks like. Maybe by helping us feel closer to and more united to our Lord, Savior, Brother, Friend.

This of course, is just a partial list. And we must acknowledge that some or many of life's crosses do not always arise as a consequence of doing the right thing - illnesses, disasters, financial troubles, broken relationships and marriages, deaths of loved ones - these things can be tremendously hard to endure. Yet, maybe, these things too can be transformed by the love of God which trumps all things and has power over even the heaviest of disappointments and sorrows - power over even death itself.

Rejoice in our sufferings? Maybe we aren't there yet. So maybe we should look at those words of Peter not so much as a statement of fact, nor as a kind of moralizing but rather as a kind of prayer, a kind of hope, a kind of sincere desire of the heart.

So, let me conclude with this prayer.

Lord Jesus - you know well that life can be hard. And you know precisely what each of us is experiencing. You know our crosses. And we believe that you want nothing more than to bring us comfort and strength and peace - and joy. Real and lasting joy. Help us to learn how to rejoice (even in a small way) each time we are asked to carry a cross, whether it be heavy or light. And may we never, ever forget just how much you love us and how far you are willing to go to pour that love into our hearts, our minds, our very lives. Amen.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.
