

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) - Saturday 3:30 - 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism - First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage - Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick - Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



When I think of keys, there are two images that come to my mind. The first is that keys are used to free those who are held captive; those in prison and the like. And so, faith in general, and in a specific way as expressed in the living body we call the church, is meant to 'free us' release us from all that is holding us back, or weighing us down, or keeping us in bondage. Belief in the saving acts of Jesus frees us. Trust in the promises of Jesus frees us. Following in the footsteps of Jesus frees us. Frees us from our selfishness, hatred, pettiness, egos, prejudice, thirst for revenge, and our sins.

Sometimes we tend to think of a life without faith or religion as being the freest, and a life of discipleship as one that constrains us, limits us, takes the fun out of life. The great irony in all of this is that it is the opposite that is true. A life in which we live simply for ourselves, doing whatever feels good in the moment, indulging every single desire or weakness is what enslaves us. Conversely, it is when we live in harmony with God that is, how HE made us - that we begin to live in the freedom God so desires, freedom which enables us to embrace all that is good and holy and life-giving. Living for God is true freedom. Living for ourselves alone is what imprisons us. And the keys of faith, the keys handed to Peter to lead the church, are what help unlock that door.

Secondly, keys are often used to open doors to something of tremendous worth, something precious,

something of great value. Keys give us access to things and places we could never go or experience on our own. In other words, keys don't simply free us from what is holding us back, they also open countless doorways to wonderful things, beautiful things, treasures, if you will. And so, in a sense, the keys Jesus hands to Peter are inviting him, challenging him, and giving him the responsibilities of 'opening up' the mysteries that Peter and the disciples will soon be witness to – opening for others a new kind of life, a spirit filled life, a life in imitation of Jesus.

Our church community provides us with opportunities to step through the doorway to a meaningful, joyful life; a doorway opened to us through Baptism and kept open through God's grace, mercy, and compassion. This doorway is made wider by the Sacraments, prayer, worship, biblical teachings, the communion of saints and countless other ways. The church is a refuge, an ark, a place of safety, guidance, inspiration, comfort, and forgiveness as we strive to walk the narrow path. It provides a path from enslavement to freedom, from darkness to light, from death to life.

May we never squander the precious opportunity a life of faith provides. And may we always treasure and give thanks to God for the church that helps us on our journey. God wants to unlock some wonderful things for all of us if we let Him.



RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

This is a process for welcoming new members into the Catholic Church. Classes are on Tuesdays and start Tuesday, September 12 at 7 PM **RCIA** is for: Adults (18 years or older) who are:

- Not Baptized.
- Baptized in another Christian faith and interested in learning more about the Catholic faith.
- Baptized into the Catholic faith but have not received First Eucharist or Confirmation.
- Wish to learn more about the Catholic faith.

What is the RCIA?

RCIA is a direct result of Vatican II, which called for a revival of the Adult Catechumenate. This goes back to the early traditions of the church where the Apostles welcomed newcomers into the community of faith. RCIA is the way all our Catholic communities throughout the world will be initiating newcomers into the Catholic church.

Note: Four out of five individuals who investigate the Catholic community do so because friends, relatives or neighbors extend personal invitations. Spread the good news by inviting someone!

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? — Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.


LOW IMPACT AEROBICS SIGN-UPS


