

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office, Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) - Saturday 3:30 - 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism - First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage - Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick - Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

From the Pastor's Desk



Today's gospel brings us to Mount Tabor with Peter, James, and John accompanying our Lord. In the previous chapter, Jesus had just discussed for the first time His pending suffering and death. That message the disciples had not at all been willing to hear nor to accept. Here on the mountain, Jesus offered some encouragement by this profound revelation. Jesus pulled back the veil revealing His glory. He appeared dazzling white and was conversing with Moses and Elijah. Moses was the instrument God had used to convey His Law to His People. Elijah was the instrument imparting prophetic message of encouragement and correction to the People of God. Jesus is the very Word of God ... The Father's full and complete revelation to His People ... the hope and salvation of the world ... the bread of life ... the grace and very life of God among His People.

Peter, James, and John see Jesus in all His glory speaking with Elijah and Moses. Jesus is Lord of the living. Peter wants to capture and preserve this moment. He does not desire this to be a fleeting glimpse.

Peter observes that it is "good that we are here." Peter seeks permission to construct three tents.

A bright cloud cast a shadow. From the cloud, came a voice "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him."

Listen to the Law, of course ... listen to the direction and admonition of the prophets, certainly ... but overall listen to the voice of Jesus, the complete and total expression of the Father to us His People.

We tend to dismiss many of the words and actions of Peter at many times as being impetuous and ill-founded. Here we see him wishing to capture and preserve the very glory of God. Would he be capable of containing this manifestation of Christ in its fullness and essence? ... Still, this is not that dumb an idea.

We should ask Jesus to perfect within us that dwelling place in our hearts in our souls for His grace and glory to abide. By our baptism, we have begun to build that tent. May the Holy Spirit fill that tent. The stakes are high.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? — Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.


