

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) - Saturday 3:30 - 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism - First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage - Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick - Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

From the Pastor's Desk



Today's readings are a real wake up call to me. The prophet Malachi in the first reading directs his frustrations at the priests. Malachi tells them that they are to uphold the covenant and show no partiality or favoritism to the rich in keeping the quality sacrifices for themselves. They are to recognize all as children of God. Jesus in the gospel condemns the burdens Pharisees are placing on others while seeking glory in their positions.

All authority, whether as a teacher or parent or leader or a priest comes from God. Where pride, ego, arrogance, and power corrupt, the consequence is that all people suffer. Having any leadership role makes us accountable to God and we need to be able to respond to God with confidence in the vocation He has given us.

But our leadership needs to talk the talk based on God's words, meaning based on truth, justice, integrity, mission, and purpose. We need to not only talk the talk but walk the walk. We need to use our gifts to serve others. When we speak one way and live another, we will be leading others away from God and thwarting the responsibility He has entrusted to us.

The gospel message is a very sobering one. We are placed in positions of responsibility, and we must always

remember that our teaching, our actions, and our leadership need to be based on the laws of God and His Church. Living the life of faith within the Church brings us up against the hard realities of our human weakness, and the glories of our human lives transformed by grace. There are times we are tempted to give up. There are times we are deluded about ourselves and fall into sin. Jesus knows how we are tempted and gave us the sacraments to help us with our temptations. Penance helps us to face up to our faults without despairing and heals them through prayer and good works. The Eucharist nourishes us with grace and joins us closer to Christ.

God has given us all the gift of faith and He needs us to be like St. Paul in his love for his people. St. Paul in today's reading was as gentle as a nursing mother is in caring for her children. He shared not only the gospel of God, but his very self. Paul was preaching with the example of his life and not just his voice.

We need to follow the same road. We need to be there for each other. I promise to do my best for you, to pray for you and I ask for your prayers, that I may continue to be deserving of being called Father.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? — Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.
