

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) - Saturday 3:30 - 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism - First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage - Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Faith can sometimes be viewed as complicated, especially regarding to our rich Catholic faith. There is systematic theology where we come to understand the great gift of our sacraments and all the tenants of the faith which we profess in the Creed. There are over 2000 years of history; saints, councils, heresies, and reforms. We have all sorts of prayers, litanies, countless numbers of devotions, and the rosary. We have different liturgical seasons and liturgies to go with them. There is church or canon law and moral theology giving us the foundation of forming a good conscience. Then there is the formal structure and hierarchy of the church. There are dozens of parish ministries, events, charitable groups, and fundraisers. So, you might say that if anything in this world can be complicated, faith is it.

The Pharisees certainly felt that way. Part of being a good Jew in the time of Jesus was doing all sorts of things in a precise prescribed way. And many Jewish people would diligently and faithfully strive to live out and obey the 600 plus laws that were 'on the books', so-to-speak. This was a pretty complicated way to go about one's daily life.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' answer to their question of which of the many laws was the greatest ... was about Him trying to get them to see the elaborate system of rules they had devised was not the core of what it meant to live a life of faith - to be "faith-ful". No; the rules, laws and customs were not

supposed to be proof that faith was complicated, but rather existed to support a simple, basic idea.... a principle that was at the heart of being faithful to God. **Love**.

That's it, four little letters. L-o-v-e.

The whole law was built on love - the two truths. Love God and love your neighbor. Adherence to the rules and regulations isn't necessarily what is pleasing to God. Love is what ultimately pleases God. Love is at the heart of true faithfulness. Love is the essence of who God is. If we ever start doing things for any other reason than love - we are doing something wrong. We are straying from the path. We are falling short of living the beautiful God-centered life He so desperately wants for us.

And so, being a Christian, a faithful disciple does not mean we have to first master and comprehend an in-depth knowledge and practice of our Catholic faith- not that these things can't be helpful. But every single person can embrace the fullness of the Christian faith right now, in this moment, in this time and place. We don't need a lifetime to get 'good' at it to be a superstar in our faith.

It's not that complicated. Challenging? Yes. Difficult? At times.

Faith expresses itself in love. Nothing more, nothing less. Jesus wanted to make sure the Pharisees knew that. And He wants us to know it too.

New to the parish? — Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.




