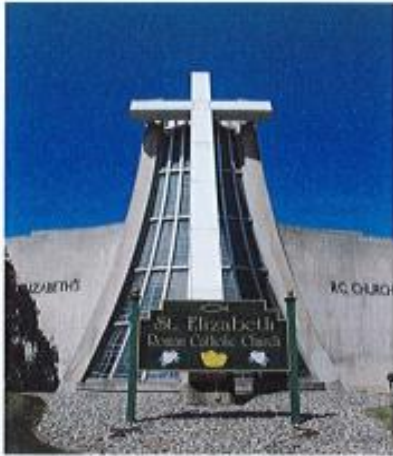

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Our reading from the book of Job and our Gospel passage from Mark place before us a choice - a choice that lies at the heart of being a person of faith. As you know, our actions almost always have consequences, they almost always shape our world or shape the lives of others in one way or another. They are rarely 'neutral', rarely have little impact. If that is the case, we must ask ourselves an important question: "Am I a person who adds to the burdens of others, or do I ease them?"

The book of Job is really one of the richest stories in all of Scripture - for it speaks of some very deep truths, truths which are universal to human beings everywhere. The heart of the story of Job involves what Job comes to realize about life as illustrated by the conversation between God and Job regarding God's inscrutability and sovereignty. As you might remember, toward the end of the story God essentially points out to Job that he will never understand God's ways. That's not how it works. God is God and we are not. When Job begins to accept this fact, when he comes to this realization, his life changes. The story tells of specific blessings Job receives from God. Yet the real 'gift' he received was a heart no longer fixated on the 'why', but rather a Job humbled enough to admit that he doesn't have the answers and won't be able to figure it all out....and that's ok.

The question remains for us - Are we simply supposed to be resigned to our struggles, resigned to disappointments, resigned to injustices, resigned to grief? That's where the Gospel comes in - for we see quite clearly, Jesus (the model for us all) not ignoring the suffering in front of Him but doing something about it. Jesus is doing what he can to alleviate the pain and brokenness and sorrow of others - reaching out in love to people in need.

Again - will we add to the burdens of others, or help ease them? Will we build up rather than tear down? Will we heal rather than harm? Will we love rather than hate? Will we contribute to making the world a little kinder, a little more compassionate, a little more bearable?

Job shows us that we will never really understand how or why our lives unfold as they do, never really comprehend our difficulties, struggles, and sorrows. Yet just because God is 'in charge' doesn't give us permission to do nothing. In fact, the opposite is true. Where we see pain, where we see suffering, we have a choice. What choice will we make?

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS: (R.C.I.A.)
