

#### Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

#### Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) - Saturday 3:30 - 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism - First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage - Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick - Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



What are you looking for?' Such a simple question from the mouth of Jesus. He noticed that two of John the Baptist's disciples had begun following Him. And (as most of us would probably do) He turned around and inquired as to what they were doing, why they were following Him, what they were hoping to achieve, or to paraphrase Jesus, what they were looking for? Such a simple and direct question, and yet Andrew and the unnamed disciple don't really come up with an answer. Maybe they were distracted, in awe, intimidated, embarrassed, or did not hear the question. Possibly they really didn't know the answer.

Of course, John had said something quite dramatic to them as Jesus walked by: 'Behold the Lamb of God', a title that would almost certainly have been unclear to them in regard to its' meaning. Yet, John's words sparked something in those two men that day, motivated them to pay some attention to Jesus, inspired them to give Him a closer look. But exactly what did they see that day?

It would be naive to assume that all those who came into contact with Jesus immediately saw something divine in Him, or instantly thought He was some kind of incredibly wise or special or powerful man. Scripture and our basic life experiences tell us otherwise. My guess is that for every person who was completely enamored with Him, there were probably ten who didn't get what all the fuss was about.

Why the difference?

The answer may lie with that simple question, 'What are you looking for?'

It may seem that it would be easy for a person to see what is right in front of him or her. But that is simply not the case. Have you ever looked for something you know is right in front of you, but you can't seem to locate it?

Have you ever not been able to find something on a shelf or look for a particular puzzle piece and someone else walks up and finds it right away? The truth is that sometimes we can't see what is right in front of us because of some misconception or some kind of false preconceived notion of what it is that we are looking for.

The spiritual life is no different. The Jewish people in the time of Jesus had specific ideas as to both the kind of Messiah that would come to rescue Israel and as to the way God traditionally worked in the world. Jesus really didn't meet either of those expectations. And so many couldn't see Him for who He was.

Therefore, if we are looking for the wrong thing or looking for God to reveal himself to us on our terms as we expect him to, we almost certainly will look past what is right in front of us. We won't see what our loving God desperately wants us to see...won't experience life with all the meaning, purpose, hope and possibility that God intends.

If we are looking for a God who will give us everything we want, when we want it, or places no expectations or demands on us, or someone to take away all our pain and struggles and challenges or wants us to remain in our comfort zone and never change, that God doesn't exist.

"What are you looking for? 'How we answer that makes all the difference.

#### **INFANT BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

#### FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

#### **CONFIRMATION**

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

#### **MARRIAGE:**

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

#### PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

#### OLD PALM COLLECTION



You may bring your old palms to church anytime from now to February 4<sup>th</sup> for us to dispose of properly. During the 1800s, both the **Sacred Congregation for the Rites** and the **Holy Office** issued determinations concerning the issue of 'blessed items.' Here are a few examples: A Chalice which becomes "unserviceable" is not to be sold, but must be used for some other sacred purpose, or melted. Polluted or excess holy water must be poured into the ground. A broken Rosary or religious statue normally would be buried. Palms are to be burned, and the ashes then used for distribution on Ash Wednesday or returned

to the ground. The underlying idea is that what has been dedicated to God should be returned to God, in a sense, the same way a person's dead body is committed to the earth. Never should one just "throw out" what has been dedicated to God. The normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned, if possible, (and then the ashes buried) or if not burned simply buried.




