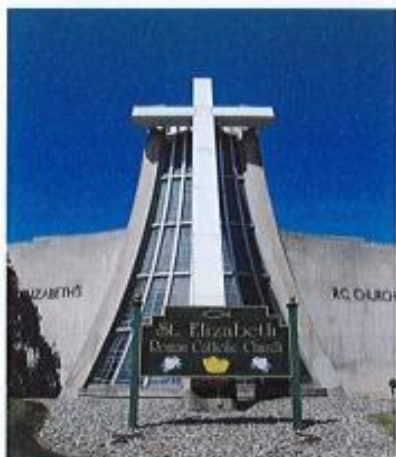

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The Gospel reading is one which really does two things for me. The first is that it gives me hope. The reason I say that is simple; there are all sorts of things in me that are not healthy, holy, and life-giving. It's never easy to say but it's the truth. I'm a sinner. I can carry grudges, say the wrong thing, and do the wrong thing. I can harbor petty and prejudicial attitudes. I can judge where I shouldn't. I can act out of self-interest and not always with the wellbeing of others in mind. I could go on and on. Maybe you feel the same way. Put simply; there can be at times, a kind of ugliness within me, a lack of generosity of heart, a spirit of 'me first'. In other words, I'm kind of broken and I don't like that. I wish these things could be taken away, removed, and made powerless.

Then we hear the scripture. A tormented man in the grips of something he seems to have no power or control over encounters Jesus and Jesus makes it all better. Our loving God steps in and restores the man to health, to wholeness, to a life free from the forces that seek to drag him down a dangerous and unholy path. Jesus doesn't ignore the man, nor flee from him. Rather, He encounters him, and the man's life is changed forever.

I said earlier that this reading gives me hope because, in many ways, I am that man. My heart is grateful for a God who wants nothing more than to reach out and fix whatever is broken, heal what is wounded, and remove whatever is getting in the way of us being the best we can be. This gospel reading shows me that I can't make it

through life alone, but I don't have to. That part gives me hope. The other way this reading affects me is that it clearly challenges me. Probably the greatest challenge each of us has in living out our faith is genuinely believing we are called to live lives in imitation of Christ. Jesus came to save us, that is true. Jesus also came to show us how to live, how to think, how to see, how to act; that is, how to love. It was Jesus' refusal to do anything BUT love that led Him to the cross, a love so strong that it even rendered death powerless. Imagine that death has no power in the face of perfect love.

While we will never love as perfectly as Jesus, we are called to strive for precisely that - to try to do the right thing by every person in every situation. God wants nothing less from us. Jesus gave that sort of faithfulness to His Father and the consequence was a miracle of the highest order.

We can't just see ourselves as the man tormented by the demon in today's gospel. We must also see ourselves as Jesus - as the one reaching out to the person in pain, reaching out in love, helping the man be free of all that is keeping him bound. We can't simply say, 'That's God's problem.' God's problems are our problems - not because it has to be that way, but because God wants it that way - He wants us to share in His mission, share in His goodness, share in His very life. And we can do that by loving. It's as simple as that.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

INFANT BAPTISM:

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for two years before reception.

CONFIRMATION

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member's enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before reception.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.
