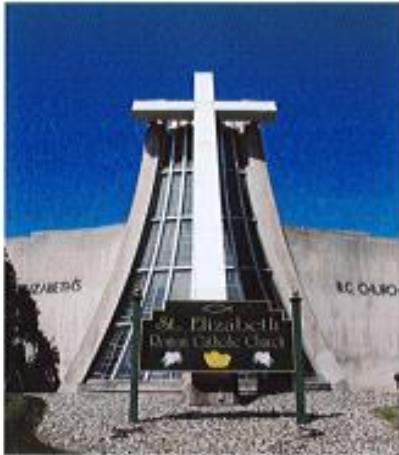

Parish Registration

Roman Catholics living in the parish boundaries should be registered with St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Registration and regular participation at Mass are required for the administration of the Sacraments, Certificate of Eligibility, and attendance in C.Y.O. and P.R.E.P. Please register at the parish office. Registration packets are also located in the church foyer and on the church website.

Sacraments

Reconciliation (Confession) – Saturday 3:30 – 4:15 PM and by appointment.

Baptism – First Sunday of the month. Please contact the parish office early in the pregnancy to begin arrangements. Family must be registered with the parish. Preparation class for parents is held monthly.

Marriage – Engaged couples should contact the parish office at least six months in advance of their proposed wedding in order to set a date with the priest. Either the groom or bride should be a registered parishioner and practicing at St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. Would you like to learn more about the Catholic faith or become Catholic? Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick – Hospitals are visited on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to report emergencies.

Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors – You must be registered with the parish, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, the marriage must be recognized by the church. All requests for 'Certificate of Eligibility' are to be made well in advance to the parish office.

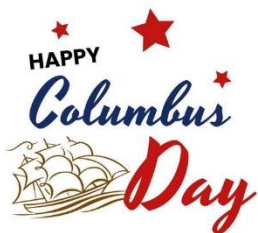

WRITINGS FROM DEACON

With God all things are possible. Do you believe that? Does God believe that? In the Dobbs decision, the ruling in Roe vs. Wade was held in abeyance. States would now make determination reflective of the sensibilities of the constituents of each state. In some jurisdictions, a more destructive precedence would be entertained ... in others, a protective preference would be supported. For those directly facing the dilemma presented, the circumstances are never easy. The choice, however, is simple. The situation of fear and unpreparedness are devastatingly overwhelming. Without support and resources hopelessness becomes the rule of the day. Proclaiming the gospel message, “I came that they might have life.” “This is my body given up for you” can be of slight support to those in a corner with backs to the wall. If we as a Christian people live and embrace this message in solidarity with those in these circumstances, we strengthen the Body of Christ. In what ways can we be a point of light in a time of darkness? How can we build up and sustain others experiencing distress?

We must not lose hope. Unanimity, majority, and consensus are elusive. Society doesn’t deal in absolutes. If all people were asked if life is important and sacred from conception to natural death, there would be outliers in any survey. Founding documents of our nation would suggest a preference for pursuit of happiness, liberty, and life...surprisingly not in that order.

SACRAMENTS

New to the parish? – Register as a new member to receive Sacraments.

BAPTISM: (Infant to Age 6)

Baptisms are currently being celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. Registered parish members may contact the parish office as soon as they learn that a child is on the way but should contact the parish office at least two months prior to the Baptism to register for the Baptism Class.

FIRST PENANCE / EUCHARIST:

Normally received in 2nd grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

CONFIRMATION:

Normally received in 8th grade. Parish member’s enrollment in St. Elizabeth Regional School or Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P) is required for at least two years before sacrament is received.

MARRIAGE:

At least six months before your anticipated wedding. Contact the pastor for a meeting to go over information regarding scheduling and the preparation process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:

Contact our parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to surgery or during serious illness. Holy Communion is brought to the homebound monthly.

*Memorial of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus
Virgin and Doctor of the Church*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we commence Respect Life Month, we celebrate the gift of life on the memorial of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus, affectionately known as “The Little Flower.” A Virgin and Doctor of the Church, she guided her life by the belief that “every flower created by [Our Lord] is beautiful” and part of “Our Lord’s living garden.” Despite her littleness, she knew herself loved by Him and reflected this in the way that she loved and served those around her.

Today, we live in a country in which the law does not recognize our “littlest” ones as loved, important, or valued. In the eyes of society, they do not have any rights because they are not visible.

Fortunately, we are no longer under Roe v. Wade, and our elected representatives now have the authority to reduce or eliminate abortion completely. However, today we must confront the consequences left behind by this fifty-year regime, which has unfortunately led many Americans, including Christians, to accept some form of abortion.

While it is vital to confront all threats to human life, I, along with other U.S. Bishops, emphasize that “abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone.”

We may feel surrounded by the darkness of death, and the enemy of our souls may try to convince us that there is nothing we can do. However, Saint Thérèse reminds us that “Our Lord does not look so much at the greatness of our actions, nor even at their difficulty, but at the love with which we do them.”

This month we can transform our everyday mundane tasks—such as cooking dinner, writing a challenging college paper, taking out the garbage, and driving patiently in traffic—into meaningful prayers. By offering these small sacrifices with love, we can strengthen our prayers for the mother considering abortion, for the centers offering life-giving options to pregnant mothers, for the child at risk of losing his or her life, or for the medical staff at abortion clinics who may not fully understand the impact of their actions.

Importantly, as citizens, we have the ability and the right to influence the legislative process that effects abortion laws in our Commonwealth and in our Nation, by bringing our properly formed consciences into public discourse. Voting is another solemn obligation we have and is a means to express our faithful citizenship.

Please join me in praying that, through the intercession of Saint Thérèse, we may bring awareness to the evils of abortion and courageously fight for the rights of the most vulnerable.
